The Cadetship and Job Opportunity

- One year practical biological horticulture training in Samoa under Organic Matters Foundation and Soil Health Pacific (see overleaf for more information about OMF and SHP)
- Basic wage offered to cover cost of living in Samoa during training
- Organic diploma course by correspondence (one year)
- Upon successful completion of the training, job opportunity in an organic farm (currently going through conversion) in Karaka, South of Auckland

Key Selection Criteria

The ideal candidate will need to:

- Choose horticulture as a career; farming is in the blood
- Have a passion about organics and biological farming
- Be prepared to work and study at the same time
- Have a practical farming background, preferably a horticultural operation (e.g. vegetable production)
- Previous basic horticulture diploma would be preferred but not a pre-requisite if have extensive horticultural experience.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: When would I start?

A: The programme would start in September 2012 and finish in one year.

Q: Will I need a visa in Samoa?

A: You will need a temporary resident visa to stay one year in Samoa. You will need to obtain a police clearance and insurance. SFF will be fully supporting your visa application.

Q: Will I need transport in Samoa?

A: Yes, just like any employment, you will most likely need to travel from your accommodation to the farms to which you are allocated. There will be a pool car in SHP available for work purpose. As you may be required to drive farm vehicles you will need to have a driver's licence.

Q: How long does the cadetship run?

A: One year full time including distance learning.

Q: Where would the cadet work following graduation?

A: You would work full time on Snap Fresh Foods Farms in Auckland, New Zealand

Q: What skills and qualifications would be obtained in the cadetship?

A: Organic horticulture diploma with an Australian university via distance learning plus classes in practical organics operations. Organics farm operations and people management skills.

Q: Would I be earning a cadet wage?

A: You will receive a basic wage to cover standard living expenses while on the program.

Q: What will be the terms of my employment?

A: As a member of the farm staff, you will be given a written contract to sign setting out such items as salary, holidays and so forth.

As per the Holiday Act, you are entitled two holidays of two weeks duration each, totalling 4 weeks if completion of one year service. On top of that, SFF would offer you two paid return flights a year back to NZ for those holidays.

Q: Following completion of the cadetship, how long am I obliged to work at Snap Fresh Foods?

A: 2 years. This will be set out in the written contract.

Q: What expenses are covered during my cadetship?

A: The following financial support is offered to the prospect cadet:

- 1. Wages- attractive salary package based on Samoa labour market rate. This would cover the basic cost of living in Samoa;
- 2. A pool car to cover the travel needs for you to move around in Samoa;
- 3. Return air tickets twice a year back to NZ for annul leave
- 4. Temporary resident visa application fee;
- 5. Health Insurance;
- 6. Police Check fee;
- 7. Fully paid fees for Organic Diploma course from an Australia university via distance learning covering tuition fee, books and student levy if applicable;
- 8. Accommodation in Samoa;
- 9. Internet facility for distance learning;
- 10. Travel and accommodation to other islands for training purpose

Q: What sort of candidate would be suitable for this biological farming cadetship?

A: An enthusiastic, energetic, hard working and independent person with an innate desire to learn about biological farming and wants to make a difference in the world.

Q: What pre-requisites would the right candidate require?

A: You must be in exceptional health, fit and willing to learn. You must have some experience in farming and understand the physical and mental demands of the industry.

Q: Is a qualification in horticulture required?

A: A diploma in horticulture would be a distinct advantage, but it is important that the candidate has at least 2 years full time farming experience.
